Bid for Yule

Maitre Renart is submitting a bid for Yule, to be held in December. A copy of the bid is available upon request. The bid proposes to hold the event at the Village Green Community Center in Kingston. This site is almost brand new, and includes a 3300 square foot hall with a commercial kitchen. The kitchen includes a pass thru window and a full size scullery for dishes. There is lots of room indoors and outdoors for fighting at the site, and enough parking for about 150 cars with overflow parking on the street.

The site is comparatively expensive. The regular rental fee is \$250 an hour, however, Renart is a resident of Kingston, and can rent the hall for \$125 an hour with a rental cap of \$1500 (rental cap is \$2300 for nonresidents)

The proposal is to arrive on site around 8 or 9 am for setup, and leave between 9 and 10 pm after cleanup.

- The cost estimate for feast is \$700.
- The rental fee will be \$1500.
- Total cost of Yule should be \$2200.
- Expected income \$2500 with about \$300 profit give or take, depending on gate.

The Crown is also expected to attend. The proposed gate fee is \$15, and the proposed feast fee is \$10. This is more than what Dragon's Laire has charged in the past, but the

site is more costly and the fees are still less compared to other Kingdom feasts. Most of the event staff has been assembled, but there is need for a MIC.

Arts & Sciences Day Camp

Countess Elisabeth is putting in a bid for A&S Daycamp, but bid is in development and not available yet. It should be available for the September business meeting

Culinary Equipment for the Barony and the Culinary Guild

A \$2000 bid was developed for equipment for the Culinary Guild and for Baronial use. The bid consists of cooking equipment and service supplies, including dinnerware. A breakdown of items is available upon request.

New culinary supplies will go in the bins that the former culinary supplies occupied, and will go into storage. Previous culinary supplies were primarily wood, which disintegrated with time and use, is difficult to properly sanitize and keep sanitized, and cannot withstand home or commercial dishwashing. The new culinary supplies will be able to withstand commercial dishwashing and sanitation. The minimum culinary expense to accommodate Yule is \$1000. Ideal is \$2000 to fully outfit the Barony.

Part of research in developing the bid was to talk to the Madrona Culinary Guild. Their advice was to go around to various discount

homegoods stores to look for period(ish) serving wear. Another option is Corelle - it is simple and is slightly more expensive. THL Ciar has priced many things at various stores.

Speaking in favor of the bid, Countess Elisabeth shared that it has been very difficult finding and coordinating ware for food at feast events. There has historically been a shortage of serving and eating ware. We need to be better prepared. Also, every item must be indelibly marked as the property of Dragon's Laire.

The proposal for culinary supplies was approved.

Junefaire 2018

THL Kloe will be developing the bid for our nexy Junefaire. Planning is starting early. Junefaire will be at Norseland site again on its customary weekend, the first weekend of June.

The bid is underestimating profit at \$9100. It will be a one day demo again, no changes from 2017 format as of yet, except there will be a heavy eric. Cost may be slightly higher because we are expecting to be charged more for the site. Details will follow.

The fee schedule is expected to be the same as it was this year. Preliminary expenses are about \$19000, last year was about \$17500. THL Kloe is accepting applications for planning team, and many positions are already filled. Spots on the team that need to be filled will be advertised.

Pavillion for Archery

Magister Arion would like to be able to submit a bid to acquire a pavilion for archery. He will do some research and present the findings

Candlemas

Lord Emil would like to develop a proposal for Candlemas, and is exploring the possiblity of holding it at the Masonic Temple in Bremerton on 4th and Warren. The Temple would cost \$600, which would meet the need to keep the site fee under \$700. The Temple has a capacity for 400 people, with rooms for activities and classes. But, we need to have a Masonic Hall member to sponsor us for the hall rental. We also need a floor plan for a site map so that activities can be coordinated. Discussion will be tabled until Sept business meeting pending more information.

June Faire Final Report

Quick Take on the Event

Doing June Faire as a one day demo had risks, but that is what the last Board wrap up recommended. So that is what we did.

We did two things right:

- We put on a good show for both the SCA and the Modern Guests
- We advertised extremely effectively

We made a profit \$16,652 on a one day demo. This is comparable to the best profits on two day demos in the past.

Pros

The layout, demo on top level, camping on the middle and lower levels, generally worked very well. Some fine tuning will improve how things flow and fit into each

area if we use the same approach next year.

The war scenario approach was extremely well received by the Modern guests. Many people hung out on the edge of the war field for most of Saturday watching the variety of activities. The SCA turn out for the war was good. Some fine tuning next year will allow for better field use and activity flow.

The non-Eric based, Princess Bride themed rapier approach was well received by the rapier community and the modern guests.

The A&S Village and the Forge Field work pretty well. Some fine tuning for the layout will improve the flow. Do we really need 3 Forges?

Most Merchants really liked:

- An ATM on site (which distributed \$21,000)
- A well attended one day Modern Demo due to fantastic advertising
- Better sales in one day than in 2 days in the past

PR was amazing. We reached new audiences with techniques I didn't know existed.

Having a separate SCA and Modern Gate worked well. Both functioned efficiently. Some fine tuning might be considered for next year.

\$15 SCA and \$10 Modern gate generated good profits on a one day demo approach @ \$16,652, comparable to the \$17,974 on our best 2 day demo in 2015.

A stated goal of June Faire has always been that it is a recruiting tool. Judging from turn out at Fighter Practice/Social, this year was a good approach to recruiting new members.

The pack up crew was extremely happy to be off site with the truck on Sunday by 3PM.

Cons

The Port Contract must include details on mowing and site maintenance, especially completion of the leveling of the area lovingly referred to as the Surface of the Moon. Ideally, this work should be done before the rain starts this year. Otherwise we will be in the same situation we were this year with the SoM being too wet to grade until right before the event.

All of our signs need to be pulled from storage, painted white and redone. There was a critical shortage of necessary signs, especially traffic flow signs. The signs in our inventory have a variety of looks, fonts and sizes. A uniform look and feel would be beneficial.

The move to Pre-reg on-line had some growing pains. The forms have been fixed for next year already. The ability to receive PayPal payments next year will make the process much better.

Traffic and parking needs serious attention to work better. Modern parking on the road was used up and had to be extended to the loop of Imperial Way past Barney White Road. We need a lot more people assigned to direct traffic. More efficient SCA parking on site was hindered by the lack of full use of the Surface of the Moon and the last minute partial leveling that took place. Handicapped parking was not well planned out and needs better planning. We should meet with the Port this Fall to formulate a better plan.

A water truck on the roads to keep dust down would have been a good thing.

The theft of half of the straw bales due to the lack of site security after the event was unfortunate. Need to specify in the contract a date certain for bale pick up if using the same supplier.

Additional Thoughts

- Both roads into the site need to be secured by the Port or us to prevent illegal dumping and site destruction.
- Acquire at least 2- 55 gallon steel drums and label them ASH CAN. Place them next to each dumpster.
- Get a hand stamp for Modern Guests. Amber priced one for this year at under \$30.
- Get 4 different colors of "Ticket" rolls - 2 colors for each Gate (SCA and Modern). Record the Start number before giving any out. At each Gate have one color for adults and one color for kids. This will allow us to get a real head count, rather than relying on a calculation to guess at attendance.
- We could use at least one more multi seat golf cart.
- More radios would have been very useful.
- The Boy Scouts were happy to help us and said that they are willing to do more next year with proper notice.
- The Sheriff's Cadets did a lot with very little staffing. Might need to reconsider using them rather than another group next year. They work on a volunteer basis and never know how

many people they can send.

- Need to look at Modern Parking carefully and determine a better way to work it. Contracting with the Boy Scouts to supply a shuttle service with rental vans (they rent) might be a good solution. Need to compare the costs with those of the traditional Shuttle service we used at Port Gamble.
- We should set up a meeting with the Motor Sports Group to see if we can take over their lease with the Port. What we pay for June Faire now covers their costs of the site for the year. If we had the lease, we could secure the site and be able to use it for all summer events.
- Merchants fees were increased this year. Retaining the pricing is a good idea. Next year, I suggest we keep the same Sq Ft calculations and include 2 staff at no extra Gate fee as part of that cost.
- Simplify the Merchant Forms. Include language that requires them to take their trash to the dumpsters when they tear down.
- We need to seriously address our actual needs for straw bales, table and chairs. Our order was short of the straw bales we requested and we still had trouble finding uses for them all. It is very easy to ask for 20 bales for "seating" which may or may not be used. Someone has to move those bales at least twice.
- The Rapier School was very popular. We should consider adding a Tourney Fighters School to complement this approach.
- The smaller Archery range worked well. Both Archery and Thrown Weapons could have used better placement.
- War Field space could have been better utilized.
- The A&S areas could use some traffic flow fine tuning.
- The Food Merchants need better placement.
- Assign a "camp-o-crat" for the lower level. Someone who is camping there and knows the people. It would have

been quite valuable this year to be able to radio down to get a feel for what was happening when we got complaints, rather than having to golf cart down and do a walk about.

- Really needed more biffies on the lower level!
- Master Arontius MUST train someone to do the Contracts and Site Coordinator tasks.

- Need to look at the Volunteer Coordinator job and how to make it work better. House Awry is great, but we need to get more event attendees to help. A volunteer sign up point or some other approach during the event should be investigated. The idea of having a volunteer raffle with quality prizes was mentioned. 1 ticket for every hour volunteered.

- Town Cry needs to be reinstated.
- Need a designated Smoking Area for Modern Guests.
- Having someone on the Board whose primary responsibility is to say “no” and why an idea will not work is a very good idea. Thanks Dame Madrun!
