Exchequer:

I want to thank my deputy, Lord Richard Everett, for all of his hard work at June Faire. I couldn't have done it alone!

Finance Committee: No report by press time.

Baronial Steward:

- 1. The Baronial Storage Units are still navigable, even after the onslaught of June Faire. But they will require a great deal of re-organization. My Deputy (Madrun) and I will be making this happen through the summer. If you need items out of the Storage Unit, please give me as much notice as possible so I can make the time to pull things out of the way as necessary to get to the items you need.
- 2. The new Baronial Pavilion is in our hands and was on display besides the Erics at June Faire. It is as large as the Kingdom Royal Pavilion; and being a Panther is very easy to assemble. However, the perimeter poles ended up not being what we thought they might be. Even though they were less than one-third the price poles purchased directly from Panther would cost, they will not last as long and are difficult to store, transport and handle. We are looking at ways to replace them with Panther direct poles. You will see more on this as the summer progresses and a plan is developed. In the interim, the poles from the gold dagged Baronial will be used in place of the new poles for events over the summer.
- 3. The rent on the Storage Units increases significantly in September. We are exploring ways to reduce our infrastructure to possibly combine the contents of the Units, or to find some other way to reduce the amount we have to spend on storage. If you have any ideas, please speak to the Steward.
- 4. If you need to get into the Storage Units for material at any other time, please contact the Steward at least several days prior to the need (the sooner the better). 'Instant Access' is rarely possible. Contact Arontius at <arontius@comcast.net> if you need access or if you have any questions. Either myself or the Steward Deputy (Dame Madrun) can meet with you at the Storage Unit(s) depending on schedule.

Golden Dragon Pursuivant: Countess Elisabeth continues to provide consulting services to those who need assistance with names and devices.

Event Reports

June Faire:

1.) Numbers - a.) Initial estimates of SCA attendance numbered at around 1,300 attendees. But this number was based on quick tallies done with the gate sheets. When the numbers are methodically counted, that number could go down (or up). b.) It was estimated we saw around 4,500 to 5,000 Modern Guests come through the gate total over the weekend. This was not scientifically done, so this number must be looked at cynically. One item to note though were the number of repeat

attendees on Sunday from Saturday using the 'tickets' provided on Saturday.

- 2.) Reimbursements PLEASE TURN IN ALL RECEIPTS AS SOON AS POS-SIBLE FOR REIMBURSEMENT. We would very much like to wrap up the paperwork portion of June Faire prior to the July Business Meeting. There will be plenty of reminders to do so. If you have any questions, or are unsure how to make a reimbursement happen, please contact Arontius (<arontius@comcast.net>) and he will help you through the process in any way possible.
- 3.) Incidents There were no major incidents or injuries to where modern authorities were required. There were complaints of bad behavior and rude camp neighbors. Some of the worst offenders are being tracked down for future reference, but not much can be done after the fact. The lesson learned from this is that if you see

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something happen, don't just let it be. Go find someone on the Event Steward Team and tell them about it. We can only change attitudes and remove truly offensive participants if we gather the evidence and keep records that can be produced later as needed. There was also the start of yet another dumpster fire. Luckily, Althon of Druim Doineann witnessed it before it grew and was able to put it out. Do NOT put coals into the dumpster! We need to remember to provide some sort of ember collection point at the dumpsters in the future to try and prevent dumpster fires.

- 4.) Site The one surprise from the weekend proved to be the Port Gamble Uplands and parking overflow. We did not find out until Saturday that the Uplands had not been mowed for use as overflow parking. We ended up using the soccer fields and the bowl for overflow parking, which worked in the end. But just barely. Starting next month, the Mill Lot will no longer be available for parking. For future events in Port Gamble, the Uplands will be needed. Most likely, the fields behind the Nursery will be required as well. This will change the traffic patterns of the past several years and will require additional planning by future event teams.
- 5.) Lost-And-Found Lost-And-Found Items are being compiled and should be posted by this weekend. If you have a lost item you are seeking, please contact me and I'll see if we have it, or go looking for it. If you found 'stuff' amongst yours when unpacking from the weekend, please let me know so that I may post it along with everything else.
- 6.) Outside Assistance June Faire is made easier and more fun the more people who are involved in it. Many other branches of An Tir supported us with personnel and equipment which were deeply appreciated. Aquaterra loaned us Eric poles. Dragon's Mist supplied the crew needed to man the Modern Gate over the weekend (and did it with style and grace). Glymm Mere provided not only our Gate Coordinator, they provided the Pre-Registration Coordination, additional gate assistance, and several people with Family Activities projects. Druim Doineann provided a hard working crew to help with set-up and personnel support on Thursday and Friday. Their hard work was accompanied by an easy, outgoing and generous attitude. I'd also like to speak of our 'hired help'. Parking and Crossing Guard duties are hot and chaotic, but the Kitsap County Sheriff Cadet Corp did them well and persevered through many obstacles (including a car accident on Sunday to which they provided outstanding support).
- 7.) Many thanks to HE Barnet Acelin, who provided the transportation of the straw bales to the Uplands at the end of June Faire. Because of the required delivery on our part of the straw bales, Lady Inga was able to reduce the cost of the straw bales significantly, with payment for the use of the rental truck and mileage for all the vehicles involved. Thank you, Inga!
- b.) ATM Machine Worked excellently at gate! The Vendor believes that June Faire should plan on having two or three at gate in the future.
- 10.) Gate Coordinator (Francisca) Gate went smoothly. Many thanks to the Barony of Dragon's Mist for all of their assistance with Modern Gate. The members of Dragon's Mist were FANTASTIC representatives of the SCA as a whole and great introductions to the Modern Guests coming through gate.
- 11.) Marketplace Coordinator (Countess Elisabeth) Having the Food Court in the new location worked very well! It spread the crowds out across the site much more evenly than in the past. This year, OPG requested we rent temporary fencing to keep people out of the yards at the top of the hill. But because of the changes in the Marketplace, the fencing was not ever needed (and Lady Inga was able to turn it back in for some returned funds and a small restocking fee). Only incident seemed to be merchants (three at least) who wanted into the Marketplace and showed up expecting a place for themselves who were not on this year's listing. 
