Three Sisters Stew

Redacted by the Honorable Lucy of Leke

First served at Harvest Feast 2025

Three Sisters Stew from Harvest Feast 2025

The Three Sisters of pre-Columbia North America were squash, beans and maize (corn). Together, these ingredients provide most of the nutrients a body needs for a good life. Maize might be eaten unprocessed but was often nixtamalized* - prepared with an alkaline solution to remove the hulls and make the maize more digestible, more flavorful, and even more nutritious by making additional vitamins and minerals available. Nixtamalized maize is dried and ground (masa) or used whole (hominy*). It is important to use hominy in this stew; using whole kernel corn will yield a very different end product.

The ingredients are simple and easily found. I used the standard canned hominy available in most grocery stores. (The tortillas on the side were commercially made with masa.) I prefer a mix of beans rather than all one type to enhance the final flavor, though any combination of chili beans would work. The combination I sourced in a bulk foods section included Red Beans, Pinto Beans, Kidney Beans, Great Northern, and Black Beans. For the third sister, I chose to use canned pumpkin puree. I made this choice because at the time when I was making test batches, fresh winter squash was not available. It tastes quite good, and really simplified the preparation, so I left it in. An alternate approach would be to peel and cube an acorn or butternut squash.

(Ciar's note: Central and South American food research shows that squash flesh was often dried and ground up to be later used as a thickener in soups and stews. Pureed fits right in!)

I used pre-made vegetable broth, though chicken or beef broth would both work if you are not vegan. The seasonings included chopped onion and garlic, diced mild chili peppers, sage and salt. Tasted with just these ingredients, this stew is ok but not worth seconds. It is missing pepper, specifically the chili peppers native to North America. Our modern taste for chili peppers varies widely so instead of making it to my tastes, so I

opted for a pepper sauce bar at the feast. You can choose to include hot peppers directly in the stew, or even to add black pepper.

As with many stews and chilis, a long slow cooking time enhances the flavors. This recipe was made using an electric pressure cooker (Instapot), which keeps the cooking time shorter. At the event, the stew slowly simmered for 4 hours in electric roasters. It could be easily adapted for dutch oven or electric slow cooker (Crock Pot): just make sure the beans get some extra cooking time before adding other ingredients.

Ingredients for ~3qts

One pound of dried chili beans (I prefer mixed beans, but pinto, black, red, cranberry, white, navy are all good)

Two 15 oz. cans of hominy, drained

One 32 oz. box of soup broth

One 15 oz. can of pureed pumpkin (make sure it does not have added sugar)

One medium Spanish or yellow onion

One clove garlic or 1 tsp of prepared crushed garlic (you can add more if you like garlic)

About one pound of mild chili peppers (Hatch, Anaheim, ancho, etc.), washed (possible to substitute bell pepper but not recommended)

1-2 tbls ground sage

1-2 tsp salt

Optional: Diced hot chili peppers to taste

Preparation

Soak the beans overnight to soften

Drain off the soak water and rinse the beans

Recover the beans with fresh water and parboil ~10 minutes

Rinse the beans again with cold water and return to the pot

Drain the hominy and add to the pot

Add all of the vegetable broth to the pot

Cook on high pressure for 9 minutes, or at the default setting for beans on your pressure cooker

While the cooking cycle is on, prepare the remaining ingredients

Peel and chop the onion to about 1/2 cup worth (more if you like onion)

Peel and mince or crush the garlic

Halve the mild chilis, remove seeds and veins, then chop to a size that fits easily on a spoon

Optional: Prepare the hot peppers - remove seeds and chop, or open a tin of jalapeños

Quick cool the pressure cooker by opening the steam vent after the cooking cycle has ended

Stir in the pumpkin, onion, garlic and mild pepper

Add the sage and salt, stirring in well

Taste to check the flavor balance and adjust if needed - kind of dull, add salt, not smokey enough, add sage

Optional: add hot peppers

Cover the pot and cook on low pressure for 1 hour, or slow cook low for 4 hours

Serve with warmed masa tortillas and hot sauces to taste.

Meat variation

I tasted a similar dish, lamb and hominy stew, in a Hopi village in Northern Arizona.

Lamb, beef and chicken are all introduced foods brought by Europeans: rabbit, venison, javelina or turkey would be authentic to the pre-contact period.

If you decide to use meat, choose a slow cooking option. I suggest browning a pound of cubed stew meat or even ground meat in the pot while the parboiled beans are draining.

Remove the meat, but not the fond, then return to the first cooking stage of beans, hominy and broth. Add the browned meat back with the remaining ingredients for the second cooking stage. With more bulk in the pot, you may need to add additional liquid. The flavor profile will be different, so you may want to adjust salt and sage as well.

*Nixtamalization is a European interpretation of a Nuahatl word from Aztec Mexico.

Hominy is a European interpretation of an Algonquin word.

3. Purchases/Expenditures/Fund-Raising:

- a. Artunis, Request for 18 battle ponies to pull 9 chariots, will submit bid. Moved to a later date.
- b. Ciar Ingen Fiachnea – Proposal to create a special Purpose and Dedicated fund. To use merchant fees received from June Faire to provide prizes for the tournaments. Cap of \$2000 per year. Approved, initial fund with fees earned from 2023 June Faire.
- c. Printing – one handbook, 20 waivers per tourney. (add to budget annually) (approved)
- d. Web-team: request to move domain name and hosting to new providers. Increase capacity and reduce cost. (approved)

- e. Storage unit: too much stuff, safety hazard. Barony items dispersed across numerous homes. Could we have June Faire stuff in a second smaller storage unit? - not really (approved). Storage unit prices have doubled, so this is now on hold. New Storage Unit options presented and one approved by finance committee. First 6 months paid for.
- f. Request to allow \$20 per month allowance for digital communication functionality; options will be explored by the Web team. Zoom available now.
- g. Request – Incipient Canton of Misty Ridge requests reimbursement for physical copies of Incipient Canton Petition to Kingdom for delivery to the Soverns. \$200.67. Approved.
- h. Request - DL Court Coordinator, Artunis– Purchase beads, wiring, and tools to make kits for making awards necklaces. 5 kits costs approx. \$240 plus additional \$200-\$300 additional for beads. Approved.

4. Administrative Actions:

- a. Suggestion to transfer CD to high interest savings account. Look into the process. Maturity date 3-15, 202, will decide after maturity date. Passed maturity date. Revisit in 2026.
- b. Officers and Guilds. Start thinking about your expected 2026 operating expenses. We will be setting the baronial budget at the January business meeting. Another plea for 2026 Operating Budgets.
- c. Stale checks – if you receive a reimbursement check, make sure to deposit it within 60 days of receipt and before the end of the calendar year to allow for clean financial reporting to Kingdom and Society. Suggestion: Have “Void if not cashed within 60 days” printed on checks upon next available opportunity.
- d. Paid for Annual VFW Hall rental for Tuesdays. \$1300.

5. Long Term Maintenance Agenda Items (Maintained on this agenda until resolved):

- a. Purchase of three Baronial Day Shades- HE Kloe of Thira
- i. Purchase of three Baronial Day Shades: Canvas was received in June. Poles, ropes, and stakes to be manufactured / acquired and Day Shades assembled for storage. Her Excellency Kloe is managing this effort at the moment. Several people volunteered to assist in this work. M'Lord Kamar volunteered the use of an Industrial Sewing Machine for the manufacture of Canvas Bags in which to store Baronial Owned Equipment. If you have equipment, or time, you can donate for

this cause, please contact Her Excellency Kloe. Lucy of Leke purchased new rope. Reimbursement for supplies and a one-time travel allowance approved by the DLFC on 04/12/2021 to Lucy of Leke. What is next for the project? Left to purchase: poles and pins, and stakes. Hold on acquiring poles due to the increased cost of lumber. Focus on acquiring stakes. Needs physical help to assess tents and number of stakes needed. Thangbrandr to submit a bid for pole pins and tent stakes. Approved. Reimbursement made 02/01/22. Dining fly poles bid - Lucy Submitted bid for poles. Approved for purchase of materials. Waiting for reimbursement request. Bag project will re-visit after June Faire. Tent bag project to be taken over by Kloe of Thira is requesting funds. Supplies have been received. Waiting for Receipts to reconcile the cash advice. Now waiting for finished bags. In process.
